

WE ASKED

We reached out through a two-step process:

1. Face-to-face workshops

We held nine face-to-face workshops with 163 young people (aged 10-24 years) at six local high schools, the Lake Macquarie Youth Council, TAFE and two youth support programs.



163 young people participated in workshops.

2. Online community survey

The 28 actions identified through our workshops then informed a wider community online survey, which asked respondents to prioritise these actions across seven focus areas.

WHAT YOU TOLD US



We received 41 responses to the online survey from young people and 97 from the wider community. The following top priority actions were identified:



Increase the number of recreational facilities that young people can easily access



Increase entry to workforce programs for young people



Reduce fuel loads through cultural burns and sustainable urban planning



Enhance safety for women in public places and spaces during night-time



Sustainable high-density development and repurposing and utilisation of empty public buildings



A cultural centre to celebrate Lake Mac's heritage with activities that engage young people



Build an indoor venue big enough for significant events in Lake Mac

Wider community respondents ranked 'sustainable urban planning' as their top priority.	"Approve more higher density developments." "Do more cultural burn offs to manage bushland using youth."	"Emergency preparedness should ideally be a one-day-a-year course compulsory at all schools".

"Safer walking trails through Glenrock; more bike paths, more solar lighting and emergency call buttons." "Increased lighting along paths and parks at night." "Greater feelings of personal safety through active protection can increase the use of spaces and improve an individual's connection to the community. No point building cultural centres if young people can't get there."
