Draft Plan of Management for Trinity Point Reserve

Engagement Summary

Background

Council identified a need for a new site specific Plan of Management (PoM) for Trinity Point Reserve that facilitates ongoing public recreation use and management of the reserve, while acknowledging and making adequate provision for its cultural and ecological values.

Once finalised and adopted by Council, the Plan of Management for Community Land (2011) will no longer apply to Trinity Point Reserve, and will be replaced by the adopted Plan of Management for Trinity Point Reserve.

We asked

From 27 May 2016 to 22 July 2016, we asked the community to contribute their feedback on the Draft Plan of Management for Trinity Point Reserve.

The Draft Plan and accompanying feedback submission form were promoted via print and online advertising, and made available on our Have Your Say website, as well as at libraries and the Council's Customer Service Centre.

Here is a selection of just some of the comments received:

Key issues you feel need to be addressed:

'Animal and bird habitat on the foreshore reserve should not be compromised.'

'Retaining the environment and planting natives to attract native animals.'

'The protection of the Casuarina trees on the shoreline at section B of the draft plan, adjacent to the marina.'

Things you feel are missing from the Draft Plan:

'The draft plan does not provide for uninterrupted access around the reserve, some areas are too narrow, etc. Will access be restricted by any of the easements, especially in the vicinity of the marina?'

'I would like to see a leash free area. Take the dog for a walk and at the end let it off lead to run around freely.'



Next steps

Once finalised and adopted by Council, the Plan of Management for Community Land (2011) will no longer apply to Trinity Point Reserve, and will be replaced by the adopted Plan of Management for Trinity Point Reserve. The Plan of Management will go to Council for adoption on 22 August 2016.
